- 7. MIME (Mt. Ararat Middle School)


Williams-Cone team WINNER'S are invited to participate in the regional round of the <u>Great Maine Book Tournament</u> next month.

CONGRATULATIONS MATH TEAM!






RISK OF SELF-HARM?
